RiverStone Health HIV/AIDS Services

Confidential HIV Testing and Counseling

A 20 minute rapid HIV screening test is provided through RiverStone Health. This can be done with a finger stick or oral swab, and results are given at the same visit. All reactive results must be confirmed at the state laboratory using a Western Blot confirmatory blood test.

Partner Notification

If the Western Blot test is positive, your identified contacts must be notified and given the opportunity to receive counseling and testing. RiverStone Health staff can anonymously notify your partner(s) or can help you with notifying your partner(s).

Ryan White Services

The Ryan White Comprehensive AIDS Resources Emergency (CARE) Act provides funding for HIV/AIDS care. Federal funds enable states to improve the quality and availability of healthcare and support services for people infected with HIV/AIDS as well as their families. The Ryan White program provides care for those who have no other source of healthcare coverage or face coverage challenges for HIV/AIDS care.

The Ryan White CARE Act provides and coordinates the following services in Montana:

- Medical, dental, pharmaceutical, nutritional, mental health and substance abuse services
- Referrals to specialists as needed
- Assistance to HIV/AIDS patients in accessing financial resources
- Education and counseling for HIV/AIDS patients and their families
- AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP)
- AIDS Insurance Continuation Program (AICP)
- Housing referral services
- Transportation referral services
- Advocacy services
- Day or respite care
- Attendant care
- Case management
- Financial assistance for the above services on a sliding fee scale

The Northwest AIDS Education Training Center (NWAETC)

The NWAETC is a part of a network of regional AIDS Education Training Centers that are funded through the Health Resources and Services Administration. The network is the professional training arm of the Ryan White CARE Act. These Centers provide education and training for healthcare providers who treat individuals with HIV/AIDS. RiverStone Health oversees the NWAETC grant which serves the state of Montana.

NWAETC works with the following professionals:

- Nurse Practitioners
- Physician Assistants
- Dental Professionals
- Clinical Pharmacists
- Other members of the healthcare team
